Directions: From the north – Take I-25 south to Exit 6 (Hwy. 70/Las Cruces/Alamogordo), turn right at end of the off ramp. At 3rd stoplight (Solano/Spitz – 1.2 miles), turn left. At the fourth light (Hadley Drive – 1.4 miles), turn left. Go 0.3 miles and park will be on the left.

From the south – Take I-25 north to Exit 3 (Lohman Ave.), turn left at end of the off ramp. At the third stop light (Walnut Ave. – 0.6 miles), turn right. At the second stop light (Hadley Ave. – 0.4 miles), turn left. Go 0.3 miles to second unnamed street on right, turn right (batting cages will be on your right), park will be on your left.

From the east – Take Highway 70 to Solano/Spitz and turn left. At the fourth light (Hadley Drive – 1.4 miles), turn left. Go 0.3 miles and park will be on the left.

From the west – Take I-10 east to Exit 139 (Motel Blvd.), turn left at end of the off ramp. At the first stop light (Amador Ave. – approx. 0.2 miles), turn right. At Solano Ave. (approx. 3.0 miles), turn left. At Hadley Ave. (0.6 miles – second stop light), turn right. Go 0.3 miles and park will be on the left.

There will be on-site overnight parking for motor homes or travel trailers. Please contact Pam Smith at pamsmith@zianet.com to make a reservation. There is a fee, payable to the City of Las Cruces of **\$10** per night for trailers and RV's and **\$5** per night for overnighting in tents. (Day use shade tents are excluded from this fee). There are many motels in Las Cruces. You can go to the website "petswelcome.com" for more information. No food vendor on site. Lunch will be provided for workers.

Due to the small size of this trial, all exhibitors are encouraged to work. Please complete the volunteer form, because that way you make sure you are assigned to a job you enjoy and you get a free lunch.

The field will be available for set-up following set-up of ring on Friday, February 18. The field will not be available before **4:00** p.m. The surface is grass (dry). Check in is on Friday evening after ring set up. Check in time is 7:30 a.m. on Saturday, Sunday and Monday. If you check in once, you do not need to check in again. The judge's briefing and first walk-thru will begin immediately following set-up on Friday; 7:45 a.m. on Saturday, Sunday and Monday. **The trial will start at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, Sunday and Monday.**

Move ups from Saturday to Sunday and Sunday to Monday will be allowed. Written move up forms will be provided and all move up requests must be received by the Trial Secretary within 30 minutes of the completion of the day's last class.

Ribbons will be awarded for the first four places in each event for each height division. Green ribbons will be awarded for all qualifying scores.

Agility obstacles will include: Dog Walk (w/o slats), Teeter Totter (no slats), Winged Jumps, Non- Winged Jumps, 5'6" A-Frame (w/o slats), Open Tunnels and Weave Poles (with 24" spacing). All contact obstacles have rubber surface.

Anticipated Run Order (subject to change without prior notice) for each day of the trial: Friday: Regular 1&2 (EE,OO,NN); Saturday: Gamble 1 (E,O,N), Jumpers 1 & 2 (EE,OO,NN), Regular 1&2 (EE,OO,NN); Gamble 2 (E,O,N); Sunday: Gamble 1 (E,O,N), Jumpers 1&2 (EE,OO,NN), Regular 1 & 2 (EE,OO,NN), Gamble 2 (E,O,N); Monday: Gamble 1 (E,O,N), Jumpers 1 (E,O,N), Regular 1&2 (EE,OO,NN).

The **ACE program Standard Division** allows dogs 18 months or older to jump one height lower than their standard height. The **ACE Senior Dog Division** allows dogs ages 7 and older to jump 4" lower than in the ACE Standard Division. Course times in the ACE program will be 10% greater than the **Championship Division** dogs in Regular and Jumpers. Gamblers time will be the same in both programs and based on the height of the jump. Each dog and handler team can only enter either the Championship or Ace program on any one day of a trial. NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS: This trial will be held under the current rules and regulations of ASCA. Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of ASCA rules and regulations, and agree to abide by all rules in effect at the time of this trial.

<p>If your dog is an ASCA registered Australian Shepherd, fill in your dog's registration number where indicated on the entry form. If your dog is not an ASCA registered Australian Shepherd and you would like to earn ASCA titles, you will need to obtain an ASCA Q Tracking Number for your dog. Once you have an ASCA Q Tracking Number, use it as your dog's "ASCA Registration Number" on all entry forms. Dogs without registration numbers will not be tracked for titles by ASCA. You may enter the trial "For Exhibition Only" (FEO), but no ribbons or placements will be awarded for FEO.</p>	<p>It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the organizing committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such cases, no fees shall be refunded. There will be a \$30 service fee charge for any returned check. CHECKS MAY BE DEPOSITED PRIOR TO TRIAL DATE.</p>

A copy of the current Exhibitors Handbook may be downloaded free from the ASCA website: www.asca.org.</p>	<p>A withdrawal from the trial after closing date due to an injury and/or illness to the dog will be eligible for a refund up to 75% of the total entry fee paid. A veterinarian's notice of injury or illness will be required for a refund. Bitches which come in season after the closing date will be eligible for a refund up to 75% of the total entry fee paid. No refunds will be given for any amount less than \$15.</p>
<p>Weekend package: all 18 runs \$196 per dog. Junior Handlers receive a 50% discount on entry fees when entered as a Junior. Please specify preferred jump height.</p>	<p>There shall be no refunds for entries in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal.</p>
<p>First dog on the line approximately 4:00 – 4:30 PM on Friday; 8:00 AM on Saturday, Sunday & Monday.</p>	<p>All crates and exercise pens are to be set up only in designated areas. Each exhibitor is responsible for cleaning up his own setup.</p>
<p>The organizing committee may refuse any entry on the basis expressly provided through ASCA rules and regulations or guidelines established by ASCA Board of Directors. <p>Bitches in heat, lame or blind dogs are ineligible for entry, as is any dog with a deformity which may cause a judge to not be able to reasonably assess the dog's ability to function and perform agility obstacles safely, and in a manner that is in the best interest, health and welfare of the dog.</p>	<p>All handlers for a given class should be present at ringside at least 30 minutes prior to the start of scheduled classes for walk through and briefing. Any dog and handler not present when called shall be ineligible to run.</p>
<p>Any dog which demonstrates aggression towards any person or any dog, whether inside the ring or outside the ring must be excused from the agility trial. Any dog which the judge feels is not in enough control to perform all obstacles in a safe manner will be excused from the agility trial.</p>	<p>No alcoholic beverages or illicit substances are permitted on the grounds at any ZASC event. Violators will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law and barred from entry as a spectator or participant at future ZASC events.</p>
<p>No leads, collars, food, toys, or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course or within 10 feet of the ring entrance. The only exception to this rule is leading your dog on leash to the start, and then handing the leash to a ring steward. <u>Important Note: At the discretion of Zia ASC, toys will NOT be allowed in the ring for any reason including training purposes.</u></p>	<p>Practicing on the equipment in the trial area is absolutely prohibited at all times, other than the use of the warm-up equipment as stipulated by ASCA guidelines governing trials. Any exhibitor practicing on the equipment will be barred from future ZASC events.</p>
<p>All dogs must be on leash when not competing in the ring, and must be contained unless being prepared to run.</p>	<p>Any dog that fouls the ring more than once will be excused from the remainder of the competition for that day.</p>
<p>Safety shall always be of foremost consideration in actions and conduct by the handler at all times.</p>	<p>This trial is open to any dog at least eighteen months of age, including purebred and non-purebred.</p>
<p>No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, acts of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.</p>	<p>NOTE – dogs not jumping in the 20"+ / 24" (16"+ veteran and juniors, ACE 16"+, ACE Sr. Dog 12"+) will require proof of measurement (ASCA/AKC/NADAC height card) or be measured at the trial. Jump height cards previously submitted at ZASC trials will be acknowledged.</p>

The Management will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog exhibited, or for possessions of any exhibitor whether the result of accident or any other cause. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this event is in the care and custody and control of his owner or handler during the entire time dog is on the premises.

COVID-19 POLICIES

You **MUST** use the new Agility Entry Form and have it signed.

Because this is an outdoor trial, face coverings are not required; however, face coverings are encouraged during briefings and walk-thrus. Please practice social distancing at all times, remaining at least 6' apart from those not in your household. Avoid congregating.

All setup spaces and chairs **MUST** be at least 6' apart.

Handlers may wear or pocket their leash during their runs or may toss it all the way to the other side of the ring. The leash must be totally in the pocket, or if worn, ends must be secured.

Briefings will take place so there is plenty of room for exhibitors to remain 6' apart.

Course maps will be posted. Exhibitors are encouraged to take a picture of them with phone or tablet. Please do not touch the posted maps.

PLEASE WASH YOUR HANDS AND USE HAND SANITIZER REGULARLY.

HAND SANITIZER, DISINFECTANT AND GLOVES WILL BE AVAILABLE.

IF YOU ARE SICK, EXHIBITING COVID-19 SYMPTOMS, OR HAVE RECENTLY BEEN EXPOSED TO SOMEONE WHO HAS COVID-19 OR WHO HAS TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19, WE ASK YOU TO STAY HOME.

AGREEMENT

IMPORTANT LEGAL AGREEMENT—Please read the following carefully as it, among other things, may prevent you from suing ASCA® and persons/entities affiliated with it. This agreement could even require you to defend them from demands and suits by third parties that include an assertion of wrongdoing by you. (1) The person signing this Agreement represents being authorized to enter into it on behalf of him/herself, as well as (if different) the owner(s)/exhibitor(s)/handler(s) of the dog(s) for which an entry form is being submitted (all these parties collectively referred to herein as “Applicant”). (2) “Releasees” here collectively refers to the Australian Shepherd Club of America® (ASCA®); its affiliate clubs; and the officers and board of directors, staff, contractors, insurers, attorneys, and agents of ASCA® and of those clubs. (3) This Agreement voluntarily is entered into by Applicant in exchange for the acceptance of the associated entry form and permission to participate in related activities. (4) Applicant agrees to abide by the rules and regulations of ASCA® and any other rules and regulations applicable to this event. (5) Applicant certifies that the entered dog will not pose a hazard to people, property, stock animals, or other dogs, and further that the dog is current with rabies shots along with any other vaccinations required by its state of residence. (6) Applicant acknowledges and assumes the risks to Applicant and Applicant’s dog associated with participation in the event, among which could be ones associated with poor condition of the facilities and surrounding areas; security measures or lack of them; electrical appliances; fittings; show rings; the presence of unfamiliar persons; and the presence/involvement of other animals—whether stock, dogs, or otherwise. (7) **Applicant further agrees to comply with all recommended and required health and safety precautions, among which may be those related to social distancing; quarantining; wearing of face coverings; and non-participation of persons exhibiting symptoms or for whom there otherwise has been a likelihood of recent exposure to COVID-19 or other contagious diseases.** (8) **Applicant additionally acknowledges and agrees to assume the risks associated with taking part in the event though others might neglect compliance with health and safety precautions/requirements or pose an undue risk of spreading disease. For example, as is true as to any public event, there is some risk that Applicant and/or those affiliated with Applicant may catch COVID-19 or another contagious disease at the event.** (9) To the maximum extent permissible, this release is to be interpreted under Texas law, without application of its choice of law rules. (10) To the extent that Applicant—or another party suing on behalf of Applicant, or suing to recover based on injuries/death/damage to Applicant/Applicant’s dog/Applicant’s property—sues ASCA® (or a board member or staff member or agent of ASCA®) as a defendant, the sole appropriate forum (to the maximum extent permitted by law) for the suit shall be the state or federal courts serving Brazoria County, Texas (where ASCA® has its headquarters). (11) Applicant hereby releases and waives any claims Applicant otherwise might assert against the Releasees as to any injury or damage claim connected in any way to any alleged act or omission arising out of, or occurring concurrent with, the event and related activities, interactions, communications, and even adjacent premises. (12) This release is made not only as to Applicant but also for anyone who might assert a claim on behalf of Applicant or based on purported injury or damage to Applicant/Applicant’s dog/Applicant’s property, as well as any heir, beneficiary, assignee, executor, trustee, agent, or survivor of Applicant. (13) Applicant further agrees to assume sole responsibility for and indemnify and hold Releasees harmless from related claims, demands, judgments, and settlement payments. (14) These waiver, release, and indemnification provisions extend even to claims or demands asserting that the acts or omissions resulted in bodily injury or death or from intentional wrongdoing, as well as to attorney fees and other costs of defense. (15) The duties of indemnification further extend to any claims or demands asserted against Releasees that are alleged to have arisen out of the acts or omissions of Applicant, Applicant’s dog, or others affiliated with Applicant. Among other things, this means that Applicant would pay the legal defense of Releasees if someone sued them based on a claim Applicant carelessly exposed the claimant to COVID-19. (16) Applicant’s promises in this agreement apply without regard to the type of claim or cause of action asserted against Releasees. (17) To the extent any provision of this agreement is unenforceable, the remainder of it nonetheless is to be enforced. (18) This agreement is to be interpreted to provide Releasees with the maximum permissible legal protection from—among other things—claims and suits pursued by Applicant (and/or those acting on behalf of Applicant or over injury/damage to Applicant), as well as from ones based on the purported wrongful acts or omissions of Applicant. (19) Nothing in this Agreement requires you to indemnify Releasees from claims by third parties that involve no allegations of improper acts or omissions by you, those affiliated with you, nor your dog(s). (20) Applicant acknowledges having read, understood, and had the opportunity for independent legal review of this document prior to signing it.
