NO OPENING DATE. You may send your entry now.

If the trial should fill prior to closing date of September 28, 2022 Entries will be accepted FIRST COME per postmark.
Should the trial not fill prior to closing, day of entries will be allowed each morning 7:00 to 7:30 \$15.00 per class per dog.

DO NOT SEND YOUR ENTRIES OVERNIGHT,
IT IS A WASTE OF MONEY, AND DOES NOT CHANGE THE POSTMARK
Entries are limited to 350 per day.

You can email your entry form and pay online through PayPal, send \$\$\$ to lcirinelli@aol.com. You do not need a PayPal account. Confirmations will be emailed to all entered with information regarding which classes they have entered, run order and start times. ASCSC, Inc will offer Ribbons for First through Fourth place in each class, and for each jump height.

ASCA Green ribbons will be offered to any dog that attains a qualifying score.

HIGH IN TRIAL AWARDS

A prize and/or rosette will be awarded to the high scoring Elite, Open, Novice, Veteran Dog, and Jr. H teams entered in the CH program. One HIT Overall ACE (six HIT in All)

An Elite Q = 7 points, Open Q = 6 points, Novice Q = 5 points.

A faulted Regular Q = 1/2 the points. Ties will be broken by YPS

Complete rules will be posted at the trial.

Dogs must be entered at the same level in classes entered be eligible for HIT

You do not have to be entered in every class

Toys in the Ring Using a toy must be declared prior to running

Handlers using toys for training in the ring will be eliminated and must keep the toy concealed until the previous dog has left the ring and the handler and dog are in the ring. If the toy cannot be concealed, the handler must stay back 10' from the ring until the previous dog has left the ring. The handler cannot use the toy until they are in the ring. Handlers may tug or toss the toy but not further than 15 feet (4.57 meters). If the dog does not return with the toy but runs around the ring past the Maximum Course Time (MCT) their training time, they cannot use the toy again for that day. (Effective June 27, 2020) If the toy leaves the ring, the handler cannot use a toy again for the rest of the trial. If the dog leaves the ring to get the toy that has left the arena and starts a fight, the dog who left the ring will be excused from the trial per the ASCA Dog Aggression Rule. Dogs with a toy will run in normal catalog order.

Event Rules: This event will be held in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Australian Shepherd Club of America. Exhibitors, through submission of an entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of the rules and regulations of ASCA, and agree to abide by all rules in effect at the time of this trial. No entry will be accepted by any dog or handler disqualified from all ASCA programs or anyone not in good standing with ASCA. Equipment list: Slat-less Aluminum rubber covered contact obstacles A-Frame (5'3"), Teeter, Dog walk, open tunnels, winged & non winged jumps, weave poles (24 inch spacing).

Club Rules: All dogs must be on leash when not competing in the ring. Please clean up after yourself and your dog. Please take responsibility for your dogs and children. Any exhibitor whose dogs or children create unnecessary disturbances or engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may be asked by the Trial Committee to leave the trial site. No entry will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riot, civil disobedience, fire and act of God, public emergency, and act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. There will be no refunds for entries withdrawn after the closing date, or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal. Checks not honored by the bank do not constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$25.00 service charge for returned checks. Move-ups for subsequent days will be allowed at the trial. See the score table before the end of each day's trial for move up forms.

ALL DOGS CAN COMPETE AND EARN TITLES AT ASCA AGILITY TRIALS

ASCA requires a 'Q tracking' number for all non-ASCA registered dogs if you wish to have your scores recorded for titles. *If you are not concerned about ASCA titles, you do not need register your dog to enter and compete in the trial.* Forms for ASCA q tracking numbers & service membership are available at the ASCA website and will be available at the trial. Remember, ALL dogs entering at 20 inches or less must be measured, or present a permanent jump height card from ASCA, AKC or NADAC or any venue which shows the dogs actual wither height.

You may have the judge measure your dog and apply for an ASCA Jump height card.
Forms available from ASCA or at the score table

ACE

ACE Standard Division: Dog Jumps 4 inches lower than CH Division and receives 10% more time than the CH Division.

ACE Senior Dog Division (dogs SEVEN or older) gives the dog an additional 10% and another four inches off the ACE Standard division jump height.

20 inch dog in the ACE Senior Dog division jumps 12 inches.

ACE Titles do not count toward ATCH
Check the rulebook for other restrictions!!!!

IMPORTANT LEGAL AGREEMENT—(1) The person signing this Agreement represents being authorized to enter into it on behalf of him/herself, as well as (if different) the owner(s) and handler(s) of the dog(s) for which an entry form is being submitted (all these parties collectively referred to herein as "Applicant"). (2) "Releasees" here collectively refers to the Australian Shepherd Club of America® (ASCAC®); its officers and board of directors, staff, contractors, insurers, attorneys, and agents; as well as ASCAC's affiliate clubs and each of their members, officers, directors, employees, show chairs, show committees, judges, contractors, insurers, and agents. (3) Applicant enters into this Agreement in consideration for being allowed to submit an entry form and, if approved, to take part in related activities of ASCAC® and/or its affiliates. (4) Applicant acknowledges entering into this Agreement voluntarily, after the opportunity to obtain independent legal review of it and to have questions about its likely meaning answered through such review. (5) Applicant accepts the terms of this Agreement not only on his/her own behalf but also for his/her successors, assigns, beneficiaries, heirs, parents/guardians, and anyone else who might raise a claim on his/her behalf or as a result of her suffering harm. (6) To the extent any provision or application of this Agreement turns out to be unenforceable, the rest of it still remains fully effective. (7) This Agreement is to be interpreted under Texas law, without application of its choice-of-law rules, and—to the extent permitted by law—any legal action by Applicant that names Releasees as one or more defendants shall be filed and heard solely in the state or federal courts serving the county of ASCAC's headquarters: Brazos County, Texas. (8) Applicant agrees to abide by the rules and regulations of ASCAC® and any other rules and regulations appearing in the premium for this event. (9) Applicant represents that the dog(s) being entered is/are not known to pose a hazard to persons, other dogs, or property and that all required rabies and other vaccinations under the state and local law of the dog's state of residence are current. (10) Applicant acknowledges awareness of and assumes the risk associated with his/her participation and that of his/her dog(s) in this event and related activities, among which are personal injury to Applicant and those affiliated with Applicant, injury to Applicant's dog(s), and damage to Applicant's property. As but a few examples, Applicant and/or his/her dog(s) may be injured from the condition of (or failure to warn of the condition of) floors, stairways, lighting, security measures or a lack of them, electrical devices, fittings, show rings, parking areas, motor vehicles, and unfamiliar animals and people. (11) Applicant releases Releasees from any claim or liability whatsoever arising from any injury, harm, liability, or demand in anyway said to occur during or in connection with related events, also waiving any right to assert such claims that he/she otherwise might have in the absence of this Agreement. (12) Applicant also agrees to indemnify Releasees from any claim that Applicant or those acting on Applicant's behalf, for Applicant's benefit, or in Applicant's place, might assert against Releasees. The obligation in this regard extends even to Applicant's paying settlements, judgments, and expenses and costs of legal defense incurred by Releasees. (13) The waivers, releases, and promises of indemnification undertaken by Applicant in this Agreement EXTEND EVEN TO: CLAIMS ASSERTING NEGLIGENCE PER SE, CONDUCT THAT IS INTENTIONAL OR RECKLESS, CLAIMS OF FRAUD, CLAIMS INVOLVING DEATH, ACTIVITY THAT WOULD OVERLAP WITH ALLEGATIONS OF CRIMINALITY, AND/OR CLAIMS SEEKING EXEMPLARY DAMAGES. They apply without regard to the basis of the claim (e.g., based on tort, breach of contract, common law, implied or express warranty, or otherwise). Applicant's promised indemnification of Releasees also extends to claims third parties assert against Releasees said to be based on Applicant's conduct. (14)

INFECTIOUS DISEASE—Applicant's promises and assumption of risks in this Agreement also extend to the risk and any asserted harm Applicant and the dog(s) may suffer from actual or threatened exposure to infectious disease, whether COVID-19 or otherwise, and Applicant accepts full responsibility for taking such measures as may be required or prudent to protect Applicant and well as other participants in the events. Applicant represents being aware of related recommend health practices, e.g., masking and distancing. (15) Applicant assigns to ASCAC® the sole right to pursue any claim in connection with or arising in relation to the scheduled events that Applicant or those acting for Applicant otherwise might assert against any person or entity affiliated with ASCAC®. (16) There are no provisions to this Agreement other than as spelled out here and they may not be modified except by formal ASCAC® board action. This Agreement is to be interpreted to provide Releasees with the maximum protection from liability allowable under the law.
