Through submission of entry, the competitor acknowledges that they are knowledgeable of ASCA rules and regulations, including, but not limited to the following:

No entry shall be accepted from a dog or handler disqualified from the ASCA agility or ALL ASCA programs or any person not in good standing with ASCA. No one with outstanding checks to either ASCA or NHASC is considered in good standing.

Eligibility for Entry

All healthy, trained dogs over eighteen (18) months of age are eligible to compete in ASCA Agility Trials. Bitches in heat, lame, or blind dogs are ineligible for entry. Bitches that come into heat or dogs that become injured prior to the closing date will have their entry fees refunded, less \$15, pending proof from a veterinarian. Any dog which demonstrates aggression towards any person or any dog, whether inside the ring or outside the ring, must be excused from the Agility trial. Any dog which the judge feels is not in control will be excused from the Agility trial. All ASCA Agility trials shall be open to purebred and mixed breed dogs.

Any owner, handler, or spectator exhibiting poor sportsmanship or abuse towards a dog or person will be required to leave the show site for the duration of the trial and may be banned from further New Hope events. All incidences of abuse will also be reported to ASCA.

Programs, Divisions, Levels, and Classes

The ASCA certification structure is based upon Programs (Championship or ACE), Divisions (Standard, Veteran, or Junior Handler within Championship and Standard and Senior Dog within ACE), Levels (Novice, Open or Elite), and Classes (Regular, Jumpers, and Gamblers). For Exhibition Only (FEO) entries will be allowed. All FEO entrants **must be at least 15 months old**.

Jump Height Exemptions are available for certain breeds. A listing may be obtained in the Agility Rulebook at www.asca.org.

**** MEASURING POLICY** All standard division dogs entered in 20” or less (or vet/JH dogs entered 16” or less) without an ASCA, AKC, or NADAC height card or USDAA information page must be measured at check-in. This includes 20” jumping dogs not entered in 20+.** ** Please send in a copy of your Height Card with your entry if you have one.

Agility Obstacles:

The following obstacles may be used at this agility trial: Dog Walk, 24” Weave Poles, 5’ 6” tall A-Frame, Displaceable Tire Jump, Teeter-totter, Non-winged single hurdle(s), Winged single hurdles, Open tunnel. Contact obstacles will be slatless and rubber. There will be no collapsed tunnel.



Dogs must be registered with ASCA to have their titles tracked with ASCA. You may enter as “pending”, but need to send in your registration forms to ASCA at the same time. We are not responsible for lost Qs if you do not register with ASCA in a timely manner. You may enter without a QTracking number; you just will not be getting your Q’s recorded with ASCA. Pre-entry Fees:

Individual runs: \$17 each

Sat/Sun Everything Package (12 runs) - \$156 (\$146 for 2nd dog)

Half Package (6 total runs) - \$85

(packages cannot be split between dogs or added on to)

Junior Handler runs are half-price.

All day-of show entries will be \$22/run. No package pricing.

Day-of show entries will be allowed, if the entry limit is not met.

Day-of-show entries will be taken up to 30 minutes before the trial starts.

Pre-entries close Wednesday March 22, 2023. Move-ups will be allowed through Monday 3/27/23. Only emailed move-ups will be accepted at quidpocket@gmail.com.

No refunds will be made for entries withdrawn after the closing date. In the event that the trial cannot be held for reasons beyond the show committee’s control, no refunds will be made.

No leads, collars, food, toys, etc will be allowed on the course. Exceptions are for using a toy for training or keeping a leash in your pocket.

All dogs must be on lead or securely crated when not in the ring.

Entries must be made on the enclosed entry form or on ASCA's agility entry form. Copies may be made. Entries must be signed, complete, and paid in full to be accepted.

Dog sales or puppies under eight weeks are not permitted on the trial grounds.

No catalogs will be printed. Running order lists will be posted at the ring gate. Handlers with multiple dogs will be separated as much as the class allows.

Dogs may not be left unattended on the facility. Anyone who leaves dogs unattended will be asked to leave and no refunds will be made. Reports may be filed with ASCA.

There are cattle, sheep, goats, and ducks present at this facility. Please do not allow your dogs to bother them. Handlers allowing their dogs to harass livestock will be asked to leave.

You are responsible for being present when it is your turn to run. We will not hold the ring for absent handlers.

NHASC, its board of directors, ASCA, management, and the property owner assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by the exhibitors, owners or to any of their dogs, personal property, or children.

Check-in Saturday and Sunday mornings will start at 7:15. We will start walking the first course at 7:45 and begin running dogs at 8:00. **Committee may adjust start times based on entries.** Please check your final email confirmation. All dogs that have to be measured must be done by 7:45. Any day-of-show entries must be completed by 7:30 AM. Dogs checked in on Saturday need not check in again on Sunday.

Direction from Houston-- Hwy 249 North through Magnolia, then right on FM 1774 and right on Hwy 105. The destination will be on your left. It's a long driveway with black pipe fencing to a yellow house.

Direction to Louis Pearce: From Dallas/Ft. Worth-- I-35 South to Waco. From Waco, take Hwy 6 south past College Station. Take the Hwy 105 – Conroe exit and turn left. Pass FM 1774. The destination will be on your left. It's a long driveway with black pipe fencing to a yellow house.

Food: There is a gas station close that sells burgers, chicken strips, etc. There are also a couple of close small restaurants. You are also welcome to bring your own food and drinks, but please no glass container or alcoholic beverages.

Awards: NHASC will award strip ribbons for 1st through 4th place as well as qualifying strip ribbons for all qualifying runs. The 20+ and 24" classes may be combined for placements at this trial.

About training with toys in the ring: Toys maybe brought into the ring for training. These toys may not involve food or treats of any kind, may not make noise or may not leave part behind. Handlers will mark the gate sheet with a "T" at check in and will run in-order during their class. Toys must be declared when entering the ring. They will be immediately eliminated whether or not the toy is used and will have the specified time for training in the ring. If handlers bring a toy in the ring without declaring it, they will be asked to leave immediately.

**** This trial is being held as a part of our Versatility Series. Scores from this agility trial will be combined with the next weekend's conformation and stock scores to award an overall MVA award!**

ASCA's ACE Program

- The ACE (Agility Competition Enthusiast) program allows dogs 18 months or older to jump one height lower than their standard height. The current program will be called the Championship program.
 - Course times for dogs in the ACE program will be 10% greater than the Standard Division dogs in the Championship program in Regular and Jumpers. Gamblers time will be the same in both programs and based on the height of the jumps.
 - Effective January 1st, 2015, the ACE program will also offer a Senior Dog Division. Any dog 7 years or older is eligible they will jump an **additional** jump height lower and receive 10% more time than the dogs in the ACE Standard Division. For example, a 7 year old dog measuring 19" at the withers will be able to enter the ACE Sr. Dog Division and jump 12".
 - Each dog and handler team can only enter either the Championship program or ACE program on any one day of a trial. Dogs moving from the Championship program to the ACE program will be allowed to compete at a lower level if a qualifying score at a higher level has been obtained in the Championship program. For example, if a dog has earned its Open titles in the Championship program, it can enter the ACE program at the Novice, Open or Elite level. If this dog enters the ACE program in the Open or Elite classes, the Q's will be applied to the Novice ACE titles and since the dog has Q'd at the higher level in the ACE program it cannot return to compete at the lower level.
 - Points from the two programs will be separate and will not be combined except for certain Elite titles from the Championship program that may be moved to the ACE program. The "transferring" of points will only be made once and must be requested in writing and sent to the Business office. Points from the ACE program may not be transferred to the Championship program.
- The points needed for each title are the same in both programs (base, Outstanding, Superior and ATCH (called ACE in the ACE program).
 - The ACE program is NOT eligible for Finals, Merit List or HOF.

IMPORTANT LEGAL AGREEMENT—(1) The person signing this Agreement represents being authorized to enter into it on behalf of him/herself, as well as (if different) the owner(s) and handler(s) of the dog(s) for which an entry form is being submitted (all these parties collectively referred to herein as "Applicant"). (2) "Releasees" here collectively refers to the Australian Shepherd Club of America® (ASCA®); its officers and board of directors, staff, contractors, insurers, attorneys, and agents; as well as ASCA®'s affiliate clubs and each of their members, officers, directors, employees, show chairs, show committees, judges, contractors, insurers, and agents. (3) Applicant enters into this Agreement in consideration for being allowed to submit an entry form and, if approved, to take part in related activities of ASCA® and/or its affiliates. (4) Applicant acknowledges entering into this Agreement voluntarily, after the opportunity to obtain independent legal review of it and to have questions about its likely meaning answered through such review. (5) Applicant accepts the terms of this Agreement not only on his/her own behalf but also for his/her successors, assigns, beneficiaries, heirs, parents/guardians, and anyone else who might raise a claim on his/her behalf or as a result of her suffering harm. (6) To the extent any provision or application of this Agreement turns out to be unenforceable, the rest of it still remains fully effective. (7) This Agreement is to be interpreted under Texas law, without application of its choice-of-law rules, and—to the extent permitted by law—any legal action by Applicant that names Releasees as one or more defendants shall be filed and heard solely in the state or federal courts serving the county of ASCA®'s headquarters: Brazos County, Texas. (8) Applicant agrees to abide by the rules and regulations of ASCA® and any other rules and regulations appearing in the premium for this event. (9) Applicant represents that the dog(s) being entered is/are not known to pose a hazard to persons, other dogs, or property and that all required rabies and other vaccinations under the state and local law of the dog's state of residence are current. (10) Applicant acknowledges awareness of and assumes the risk associated with his/her participation and that of his/her dog(s) in this event and related activities, among which are personal injury to Applicant and those affiliated with Applicant, injury to Applicant's dog(s), and damage to Applicant's property. As but a few examples, Applicant and/or his/her dog(s) may be injured from the condition of (or failure to warn of the condition of) floors, stairways, lighting, security measures or a lack of them, electrical devices, fittings, show rings, parking areas, motor vehicles, and unfamiliar animals and people. (11) Applicant releases Releasees from any claim or liability whatsoever arising from any injury, harm, liability, or demand in anyway said to occur during or in connection with related events, also waiving any right to assert such claims that he/she otherwise might have in the absence of this Agreement. (12) Applicant also agrees to indemnify Releasees from any claim that Applicant or those acting on Applicant's behalf, for Applicant's benefit, or in Applicant's place, might assert against Releasees. The obligation in this regard extends even to Applicant's paying settlements, judgments, and expenses and costs of legal defense incurred by Releasees. (13) The waivers, releases, and promises of indemnification undertaken by Applicant in this Agreement EXTEND EVEN TO: CLAIMS ASSERTING NEGLIGENCE PER SE, CONDUCT THAT IS INTENTIONAL OR RECKLESS, CLAIMS OF FRAUD, CLAIMS INVOLVING DEATH, ACTIVITY THAT WOULD OVERLAP WITH ALLEGATIONS OF CRIMINALITY, AND/OR CLAIMS SEEKING EXEMPLARY DAMAGES. They apply without regard to the basis of the claim (e.g., based on tort, breach of contract, common law, implied or express warranty, or otherwise). Applicant's promised indemnification of Releasees also extends to claims third parties assert against Releasees said to be based on Applicant's conduct. (14) INFECTIOUS DISEASE—Applicant's promises and assumption of risks in this Agreement also extend to the risk and any asserted harm Applicant and the dog(s) may suffer from actual or threatened exposure to infectious disease, whether COVID-19 or otherwise, and Applicant accepts full responsibility for taking such measures as may be required or prudent to protect Applicant and well as other participants in the events. Applicant represents being aware of related recommend health practices, e.g., masking and distancing. (15) Applicant assigns to ASCA® the sole right to pursue any claim in connection with or arising in relation to the scheduled events that Applicant or those acting for Applicant otherwise might assert against any person or entity affiliated with ASCA®. (16) There are no provisions to this Agreement other than as spelled out here and they may not be modified except by formal ASCA® board action. This Agreement is to be interpreted to provide Releasees with the maximum protection from liability allowable under the law. AS USED HERE, "ASCA®" MEANS THE OWNER AND THE OPERATOR OF THE EVENT PREMISES, THE AUSTRALIAN SHEPHERD CLUB OF AMERICA, ITS AFFILIATE CLUBS, AND EACH OF THEIR MEMBERS, OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, EMPLOYEES, SHOW CHAIRMEN, SHOW COMMITTEES AND AGENTS.
